In the course of a press conference on 13 June 2024, the promoter of Douala's Kadji Sports Academy (KSA), which was widely reported in the press and on social media, made a number of ungrounded allegations about his club's licence situation.

In this regard, the Cameroon Football Federation (FECAFOOT) wishes to inform the public that KSA Douala has duly submitted **54 (fifty-four) licence applications** for the 2023/2024 season.

Following the usual checks and after processing, only 11 (eleven) applications were found to comply with the texts. Therefore, on 19 April 2024, the competent departments of FECAFOOT issued 11 (eleven) licences. That same day, KSA Douala was notified through its FIFA-CONNECT account of the rejection of the 43 (forty-three) other applications for the following reasons:

- Unlegalised player's National Identity Card;
- Parent's National Identity Card not legalised (for minors);
- No player's National Identity Card;
- Parent's National Identity Card unreadable;
- Non-compliant registration form;
- Absence of receipt for payment of licence fees;
- Absence of national transfer certificate (for players from other clubs);
- llegible medical certificate.

The Douala KSA club has not seen fit, to date, to make the corrections required to issue the remaining licences and has therefore exposed itself to the rigours of the relevant legislation.

In the case of the player **Rony Ulrich Jordan MIMB BAHENG**, mentioned by the promoter of the Douala KSA in his statements, it should be noted that the











Federation has sent him a letter setting out the reasons for the non-issuance of the International Transfer Certificate (ITC) in favour of the player concerned. However, to safeguard the player's career, FECAFOOT will not make the details of his file public.

The bottom line is that FECAFOOT is denouncing a well organised attempt to manipulate public opinion in order to tarnish its image and scupper the efforts to modernise football in Cameroon that have been underway for just over two years.
